Revision Activity Number 2	<p>Hexagons – Making Connections</p> <p>This activity is designed to strengthen your knowledge of a text by forcing you to make connections between ideas that are not always the most obvious.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Select a text to revise Select four pieces of information from the information bank (themes, characters, context) and two quotes and position these in the hexagons. Explain how the idea in each hexagon links to those positioned around it. Attempt to include additional information (i.e. a relevant secondary quote) whenever possible. Consider what you learn by linking these ideas together.
