Science

There are two options for Science at Corby Technical School.

Combined Science is worth 2 GCSEs.

• The course covers all 3 of the Science strands (Biology, Chemistry and Physics)

Separate Science is worth 3 GCSEs.


• Students will achieve a separate GCSE grade for Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Students studying Separate Science will cover topics in more depth and detail, providing a more in depth understanding of each of the individual strands. This can help students develop the skills required for potential careers in science-related industries.




Humanities

- The vast majority of students are required to study either Geography or History as part of our broad curriculum offering.
- Geography helps students to understand the physical world and the human impact on it
- History allows students to understand past events and how they shape our present.
- Both subjects support in the development of critical thinking, analytical skills and the ability to interpret and evaluate information.

Some students will have a meeting with their tutor or a member of our leadership team.



SIMS Options Online

- Friday morning, all parents will receive an e-mail invite to access the Options Online portal. It is important that you carefully follow the instructions to setup your account.
- Students will complete their options choices alongside their parents.
- The system can be accessed on any connected device such as a smartphone, tablet or laptop.



Timeline of Events

Options Online – Friday 14th February – Thursday 27th February

- Access will be released to parents and students tomorrow morning.
- Deadline Thursday 27th February at 5pm
- Options can be modified during the whole time up until the deadline



The school will analyse options choices to determine if all courses can run. If there are not a suitable number of students choosing a subject, it may not be viable to run.




Option Decisions (May / June)

 Final options decisions will be communicated to students and parents early in May/June.



We will look at all students' options choices on an individual basis to ensure that the subjects chosen are suitable for that child. Where we have concerns, we will communicate with students and parents/carers as needed.

Choosing your Options



Personal interests and strengths

- You are more likely to do well if you enjoy the options subject you are studying.
- Choose subjects that you are genuinely interested in or passionate about.

Future aspirations

Whilst a long way away, future aspirations can factor into your choices. If you
have a particular type of career in mind, choosing subjects that will allow you
to develop your skills in that area would be useful.

Teacher recommendations

 Talk to your teachers about options subjects, particularly when you are struggling to make a choice between two subjects. Your teachers can provide great insight to support you with making your choices.

Beware of the common pitfalls

 Be careful not to choose subjects just because your friends have chosen them, or you like the teacher. You have to make the right decisions for you and be aware that teachers may change, and your friends may not get the same allocations or classes as you anyway. Working together to support your child
